Copy Tracks to Multiple Playlists

This script will copy the selected tracks to one or more chosen playlists.

For macOS 10.12 and later only.

Installation:

This script is an **AppleScript applet** and can be run by double-clicking its icon in the Finder. However, it is probably best accessed from the iTunes Script menu.

Put AppleScripts in your iTunes "Scripts" folder. This is located at [user name] / Library / iTunes / Scripts / .


The user Library directory is hidden by default. To make it visible, hold down the Option key on your keyboard and select **Go > Library** from the Finder.

If the [user name] / Library / folder does not contain the "iTunes" or "Scripts" folders then then create them and put the script(s) in the "Scripts" folder. AppleScripts will then appear in iTunes' Script menu, and can be activated by selecting by name and clicking. Be sure to also save this Read Me document in a safe and convenient place.

How to use:

Launch the applet. Only **Playlist Folders** and **user-created** playlists will be listed. (Library, Apple Music, Playlist Folders, Smart, and Genius playlists are dynamic and tracks cannot be copied to them; and, in the case of Apple Music *subscription* playlists, probably shouldn't be.)



The window can be re-sized to display more.

Tracks can be selected/de-selected in iTunes while the applet is active. The number of currently selected iTunes tracks will be displayed as **Source**: at the top of the applet's window.

Select the playlists in the list to copy the selected tracks to. Then click on the **Copy** button. Progress will be indicated as the selected tracks are copied to each playlist.

If a track already exists in a playlist then it will **not** be assigned to that playlist again.

Additionally:

- Enter text in the **Filter field** to show only the playlists whose names contain the entered text.
- Reveal a playlist in iTunes by double-clicking it.
- To **refresh** the list of playlists, press **Command-R**. This should be done if you add or remove any playlists from iTunes while the applet is active.
- To **collapse** or **expand** all Playlist Folders, select Collapse All Folders/Expand All Folders from the **File** menu.
- To deselect playlists, press Shift-Command-A.
- To dismiss the applet, click the red close button, or press Command-Q.
