

# Make An EQ Preset Script

v2.0

## AppleScript for iTunes

Find more **free** AppleScripts and info on writing your own at Doug's AppleScripts for iTunes.

This script will itself create an AppleScript and when *that* script is run will re-create a selected EQ Preset in iTunes.

Convenient for sharing your EQ Presets accurately with your friends. Just send 'em the script.

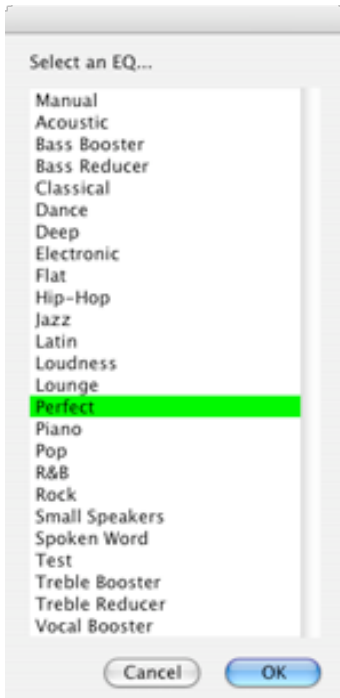

### Installation:

**To manually install:** Put AppleScripts in your iTunes Scripts folder. This is located in *[username] > Library > iTunes*. If there is no folder named "Scripts" there, create one and put the script(s) in it. AppleScripts will then appear in iTunes' Script menu, and can be activated by selecting by name and clicking. Be sure to also save this Read Me document in a safe and convenient place.

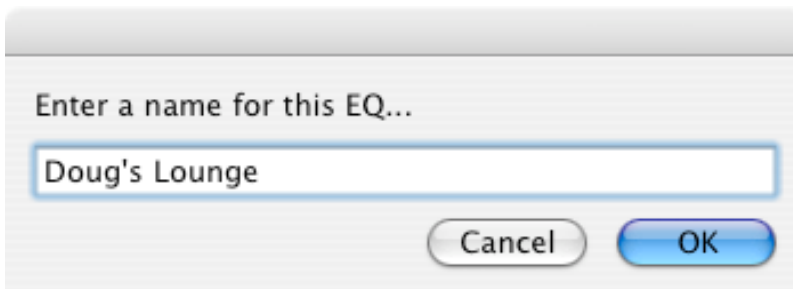
### How to use:

Run the script. It will display a list of your EQ Presets:



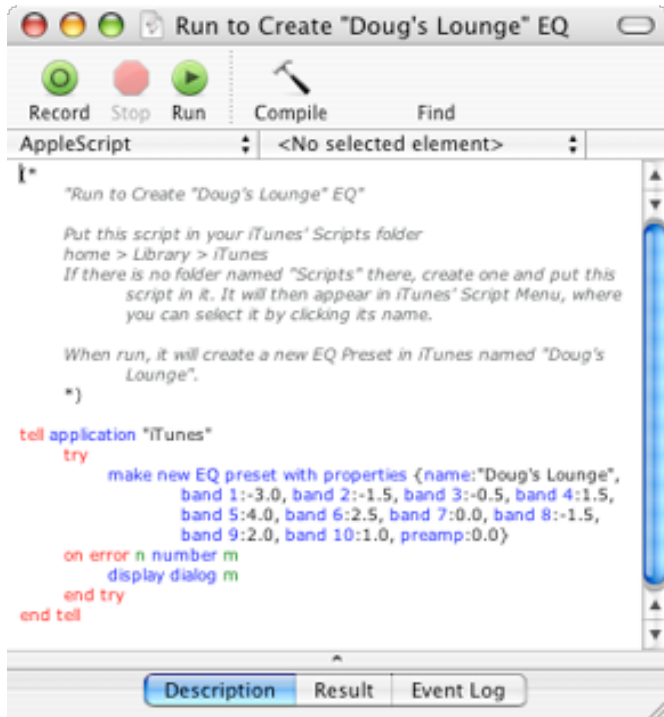
Select a Preset name (your current EQ will be pre-selected) and click the "OK" button.

In the next dialog enter a name for the Preset (it's original name is the default):



The script will get the settings of the selected EQ Preset and then create a new script document in AppleScript Editor/Script Editor. This new script will contain the instructions for creating a new EQ Preset in iTunes using your chosen EQ Preset's settings.

Here's what the new script will--kind of--look like:



This new script will be saved to your `[username]/Library/iTunes/Scripts/` folder. It will be called *Run to Create "Doug's Lounge" EQ*, for example. The name in quotes will always be the name you assigned to the EQ Preset.

When this new script is run, it will create a new EQ Preset in iTunes using the settings it got from your selected EQ.

You can email the new script to anyone with an iTunes (on a Mac, of course) and they can run it to have your EQ Preset created in their iTunes.

Make sure you tell them to install the script in their iTunes' Scripts folder, just like you installed this script.

You can also use this script to create "back-ups" of your EQs, in case you want to re-create them sometime later.
