

# Make A Text List

## v5.1

For iTunes 11+/OS X 10.12+  
Find more free AppleScripts  
and info on writing your own  
at Doug's AppleScripts for iTunes.

This script will display an alphabetical list of your choice of the Albums, Artists, Album Artists, Composers, Genres, Groupings, Movements, Works, Shows, or Track Names in a selected iTunes library (Music, Movies, TV Shows, and so on) or playlist. This list can then be saved to a text file.

OS X 10.12 and later only.

## Installation:

This script is an **AppleScript applet** and can be run by double-clicking its icon in the Finder. However, it is probably best accessed from the iTunes Script menu.

Put AppleScripts in your iTunes "Scripts" folder. This is located at *[user name] / Library / iTunes / Scripts /*.

*The user Library directory is hidden by default. To make it visible, hold down the Option key on your keyboard and select **Go > Library** from the Finder.*


If the *[user name] / Library /* folder does not contain the "iTunes" or "Scripts" folders then then create them and put the script(s) in the "Scripts" folder. AppleScripts will

then appear in iTunes' Script menu, and can be activated by selecting by name and clicking. Be sure to also save this Read Me document in a safe and convenient place.

## How to use:

Launch the script and this window will display:



*The window is re-sizable such that the right-side list can be expanded horizontally and vertically.*

Choose a tag from the **popup** and then select a library. A list of *those tags* in *that library* will be displayed in the right-side list and the number of items found will be listed at the bottom. In the screenshot above, 132 distinct Genre names were found in my Music library.

- The script creates a display of single occurrences of a tag; if you select *Name* or

*Movement* and you have track entries that have the same name or movement name then that text will only occur once; you won't see a list of six "Gimme Shelter" if you have six versions of that song; "Gimme Shelter" will be listed *once*. This only affects these tags.

To select a particular playlist, click on **Select a Playlist...** and a dropdown menu will list all the playlists in your iTunes library. Select one and then click the **OK** button in the dropdown menu.

- Depending on the number of tracks in the selected library/playlist, it may take a few moments to gather all the tag data. Don't mind the busy cursor.

## Create a Text File

The current list of tags can be saved as a list to a text file by choosing "Save to Text File..." in the File menu or by pressing **Command-S**. A Save Dialog will display. Enter a name for the text file and choose a location to save it and click on **Save**.

## Rescan

The applet does not monitor iTunes for changes. If you make changes to tracks or playlists while the applet is running—for example, you may have added or removed tracks to/from a playlist—you will want to rescan iTunes. Choose "Rescan Library" in the File menu or press **Command-R**. The current list will be updated with any changes to iTunes.
