

Make UN-Bookmarkable v3.3

AppleScript for iTunes

Find more **free** AppleScripts and info on writing your own at Doug's AppleScripts for iTunes.

Will either change the file type of the files of the selected AAC tracks in iTunes to "M4A " or uncheck the iTunes "Remember playback position" setting, making them UN-bookmarkable. Additionally, the file extension of each file will be changed to ".m4a".

When used with iTunes 7 or better, each track is deleted and re-added so that it will be *removed* from the Audiobooks Library and added to the Music Library. Ratings, play count, last played date, skip count, and skipped date are preserved.

Installation:

To manually install: Put AppleScripts in your iTunes Scripts folder. This is located in *[user name] > Library > iTunes*. If there is no folder named "Scripts" there, create one and put the script(s) in it. AppleScripts will then appear in iTunes' Script menu, and can be activated by selecting by name and clicking. Be sure to also save this Read Me document in a safe and convenient place.

How to use:

Select some tracks in iTunes. If they are Protected AACs that you have altered by running the script "Make Bookmarkable", then the file type of each track's file will be changed to M4A and its file extension changed to ".m4a". If you have set a track's "Remember playback position" setting with iTunes 5 or better, then this option will be unchecked as well.

If you are using iTunes 7 or better, each track will be deleted and then re-added so it will be removed from the Audiobooks Library. Ratings, last played date, play count, skipped date, and skip count will be preserved.

Major Note:

This script **cannot** change the "bookmarkability" of copy-protected audio files you have purchased through the iTunes Store.
