For iTunes 12+/macOS 10.12+ Find more free AppleScripts and info on writing your own at Doug's AppleScripts for iTunes.

This application will list the file paths of the files in your designated "iTunes Media" folder which are not associated with any tracks in iTunes' library.

Additionally, you can select another parent folder and its contents will be compared to the iTunes library. Includes options to Add a selection of found files to iTunes, move them to the Trash, and export to a text file.

For macOS 10.12 and later only.

This app is free to try full-featured for 10 days. If you like it you can purchase a code for \$1.99 which will unlock the 10 day trial restriction. Launch the app and click "Register..." in the its File menu to make an in-app purchase through PayPal.

Installation:

This script is an **AppleScript applet** and can be run by double-clicking its icon in the Finder. However, it is probably best accessed from the iTunes Script menu.

Put AppleScripts in your iTunes "Scripts" folder. This is located at [user name] / Library / iTunes / Scripts / .

The user Library directory is hidden by default. To make it visible, hold down the Option key on your keyboard and select **Go > Library** from the Finder.

If the [user name] / Library / folder does not contain the "iTunes" or "Scripts" folders then then create them and put the script(s) in the "Scripts" folder. AppleScripts will then appear in iTunes' Script menu, and can be activated by selecting by name and clicking. Be sure to also save this Read Me document in a safe and convenient place.



How to use:

Launch the application. Click the **Find** or **Find Other...** button:

Find - Compare the files in your designated "iTunes Media" folder against the track entries in iTunes' library and list the file paths of the files which are **not** associated with track entries in iTunes.

Find Other... - Select a parent folder in another location, then compare the files in it (at every folder level) against the track entries in iTunes' library and list the file paths of the files which are not associated with track entries in iTunes.



After files are listed, these options become available:

Add - Select items in the list and click the Add button to add them to iTunes.

• After adding files to iTunes, it may take as long as :30 seconds for iTunes to update its database. "Find" results will not be accurate until the update has completed.

Trash - Select items in the list and click the Trash button to move them to the Trash. They will not be deleted until you empty the Trash.

Export... - Click on this button to create a text file of the currently listed file paths (or only the selected file paths). You will be asked to give a name for the text file and choose a location for it. The exported text file can be viewed in TextEdit.app (among other applications).

Reveal in Finder - double-click a file path in the list to reveal the file in the Finder.

Additionally, the list of visible file paths can be **filtered** by entering text in the **Filter:** text field at the top left of the main window.

TIP: To show just the files in a particular folder—"Music", for example—enter "/Music/" in the Filter text field.

Toggle the text size by clicking "Toggle Text Size" in the View menu or by pressing **Command +.**

Notes:

- Perhaps this goes without saying, but just because a file is listed doesn't preclude the possibility that a *copy* of it may exist *somewhere else* on the machine/system or in the cloud; just that the file at the location *listed* is not accounted for in the iTunes library.
- The contents of the "iTunes Media/Apple Music/" folder, if present, will be ignored. This is managed by iTunes and is probably best left alone.
- **Ringtones.** As of iTunes 12.6, *ringtone* files (.m4r files) in the **Tones** library *may not be* reported in the iTunes Library.xml file. Thus, verifying whether or not these files have corresponding track entries in iTunes will at best produce ambiguous results.

When ringtone files are found the applet will display an **alert** that reminds you of this issue. This alert can be disabled by check marking its "Don't show this again" checkbox. Use the *File > Reset Warnings* menu to allow the alert to display again afterwards.

- It may be that tracks whose files have been uploaded to iCloud also have corresponding local files in the selected Media folder. Technically, however, iTunes is not likely to associate **local** files with **uploaded** iCloud Music Library/iTunes Match track entries, and thus these local files will be listed as "Not Added".
- If both standard definition (SD) and high definition (HD) versions of a movie exist, one or the other might not be added purposely; it varies depending on how iTunes is managing your videos.
- Podcast files will be re-added as regular Music tracks (or however their extension obliges iTunes to sort them). There's no way to re-associate them as episodes with their original subscriptions.
