

# Random CD v1.0

AppleScript for iTunes

This script will assemble a new CD-sized playlist of random tracks from the selected playlist and then initiate the iTunes Burn Disc process.

## How to use:

Put this script in your iTunes Scripts folder. This is located in *user name* > Library > iTunes. If there is no folder named "Scripts" there, create one and put the script in it. It will then appear in iTunes' Script menu, where you can activate it by clicking on its name.

Select a playlist in the iTunes Source column containing tracks you want to include in a random CD and run the script. Enter a name for a new playlist that will contain the random tracks. This name will also be the title of the CD when it is burned.

In a few moments, the new playlist will be assembled and selected, and iTunes will ask you to insert a blank CD disc. You take it from there!

## Notes:

- This script contains a sub-routine called "isGUIScriptingAvailable", written by Bill Cheeseman of PreFab Software and is included with his gracious permission. It is a part of the PreFab UI Browser download package.
- The script ensures that two tracks by the same Artist do not appear sequentially. Of course, two or more tracks by the same Artist may still appear in the playlist.
