Refresh Smart Playlists

For iTunes 11+/macOS 10.12+ Find more free AppleScripts and info on writing your own at Doug's AppleScripts for iTunes.

This script will "refresh" the selected Smart Playlists by removing the tracks they contain (*if possible) which then obliges each Smart Playlist to re-populate with tracks.

(*Tracks cannot be removed from a Smart Playlist which contains every track of the library meeting its criteria-it would simply re-populate with the same tracks.)

For macOS 10.12 and later only.

Installation:

This script is an **AppleScript applet** and can be run by double-clicking its icon in the Finder. However, it is probably best accessed from the iTunes Script menu.

Put AppleScripts in your iTunes "Scripts" folder. This is located at [user name] / Library / iTunes / Scripts / .

The user Library directory is hidden by default. To make it visible, hold down the


Option key on your keyboard and select **Go > Library** from the Finder.

If the [user name] / Library / folder does not contain the "iTunes" or "Scripts" folders then then create them and put the script(s) in the "Scripts" folder. AppleScripts will then appear in iTunes' Script menu, and can be activated by selecting by name and clicking. Be sure to also save this Read Me document in a safe and convenient place.

How to use:

Launch the script:



The window is resizeable.

The Smart Playlists in your iTunes library will be displayed. Smart Playlists within Playlist Folders will be displayed within the folders that contain them at the top of the list. Playlist Folders cannot be selected.

- **Filter** Enter text in the filter field at the top of the window to display the Playlists whose names contain *that* text.
- Double-click on a Playlist's name in the list to select it in iTunes.
- Select All (Command-A) and Select None (Shift-Command-A) options are available in the Edit menu.

Select the Smart Playlist(s) in the list that you want refreshed and then click the "Refresh" button.

Not all Smart Playlists can be refreshed and Smart Playlists that use the "Limit to" criteria are more likely to be "refreshable". iTunes will prevent tracks from being removed from a Smart Playlist if it already contains every track that meets its criteria (it likely would re-populate with the same tracks anyway). Such Smart Playlists will effectively be ignored by the script.

This could go without saying, but: Tracks are **not** removed from your iTunes library, just removed from the selected Smart Playlists.

• If you create or delete any Smart Playlists in iTunes while the script is running it will not be aware of the changes until you choose *File > Get Smart Playlists* (**Command-G**).
