Rip These To My Mobile v1.0

AppleScript for iTunes written by Ken Tidwell

Copies files of selected tracks to an SD card mounted on the desktop. Tested with the Motorola E6801. May work with other devices.

How to use:

Put this script in your iTunes Scripts folder. This is located in *user name* > Library > iTunes. If there is no folder named "Scripts" there, create one and put the script in it. It will then appear in iTunes' Script menu, where you can activate it by clicking on its name. (This script is an AppleScript Application, or "applet", and can be run from anywhere by double-clicking it. However it is probably best accessed from iTunes' Script menu.)

From the Author:

I have a Motorola E680I, with Bluetooth and USB. It also sports a 1gb SD card. This phone has an extensive feature set, and great sound, including support for stereo Bluetooth headphones.

I wanted an easy way to move songs from my iTunes library and existing playlists. In my case, the E680i, when connected via USB, shows up as two volumes on the desktop - one is the main memory and the other is the SD card. I use the script to rip songs (AAC out) directly to the SD card on the phone. This works great - I'm looking to expand the process as I learn more about the phone, which happens to be Linux based.

Also, I'd like to be able to use Bluetooth on occasion, however I notice that the application Apple provides (Bluetooth File Exchange) doesn't seem to support Applescript.
