Search a chosen category or the selected playlist for user-entered text by All, Song, Artist, Album, or Composer and copy the track results to a new Search Results playlist. Can optionally re-create or append to the Search Results playlist on each run. Floats over iTunes while active for easy access.

OS X 10.10 and later only.

Installation:

This script is an **AppleScript applet** and can be run by double-clicking its icon in the Finder. However, it is probably best accessed from the iTunes Script menu.

Put AppleScripts in your iTunes "Scripts" folder. This is located at *[user name] / Library / iTunes / Scripts /*.

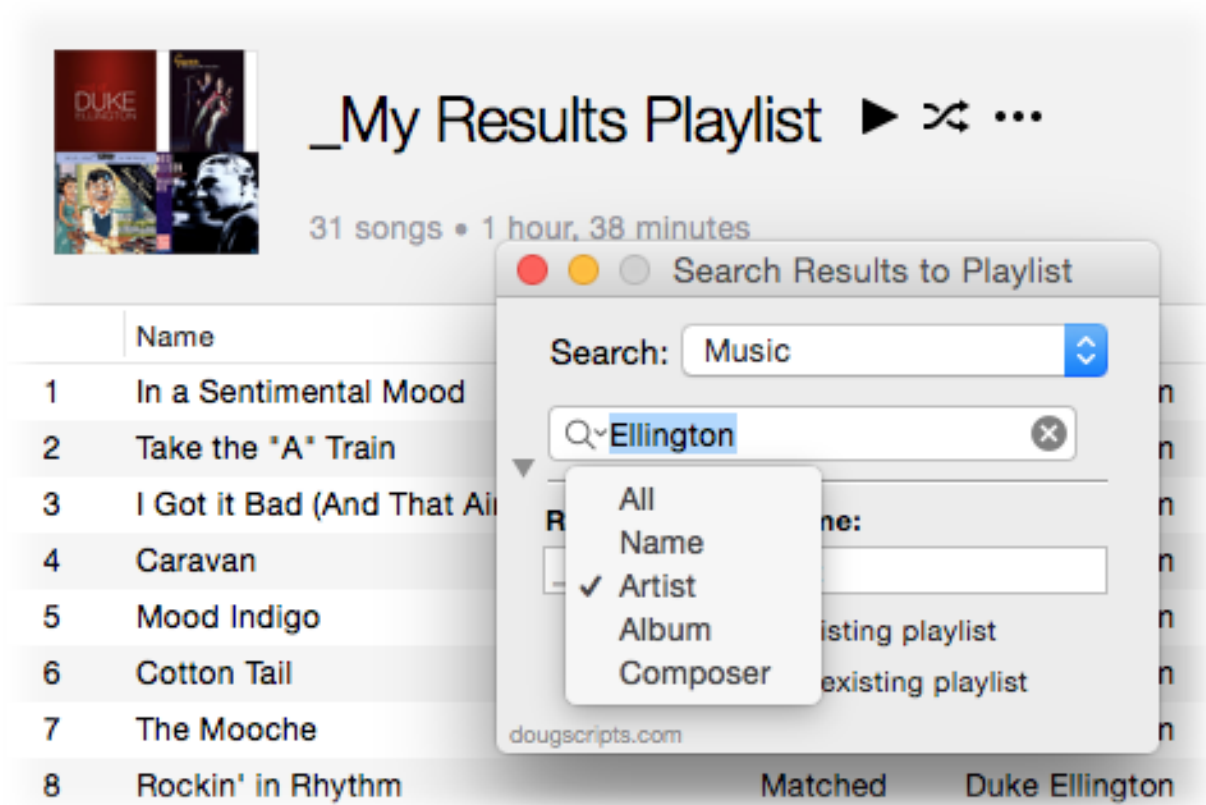
*The user Library directory is hidden by default. To make it visible, hold down the Option key on your keyboard and select **Go > Library** from the Finder.*

If the *[user name] / Library /* folder does not contain the "iTunes" or "Scripts" folders then then create them and put the script(s) in the "Scripts" folder. AppleScripts will

then appear in iTunes' Script menu, and can be activated by selecting by name and clicking. Be sure to also save this Read Me document in a safe and convenient place.

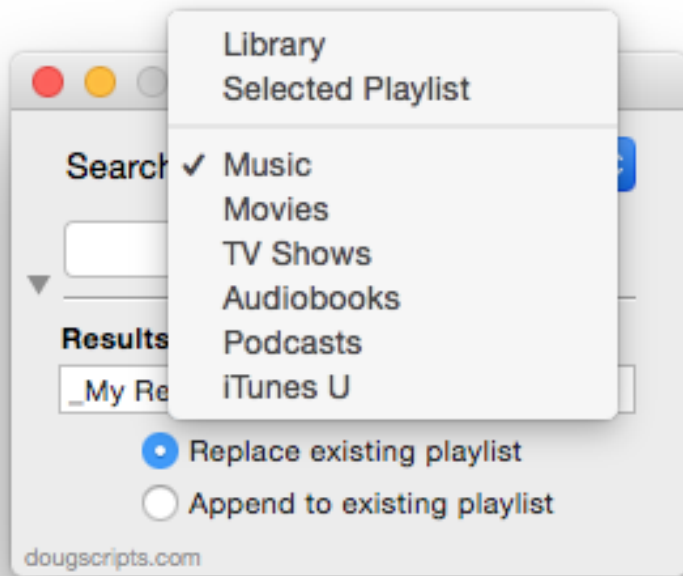
How to use:

Launch the script by clicking its name in the iTunes Script menu. Its window will float over iTunes while it is active:

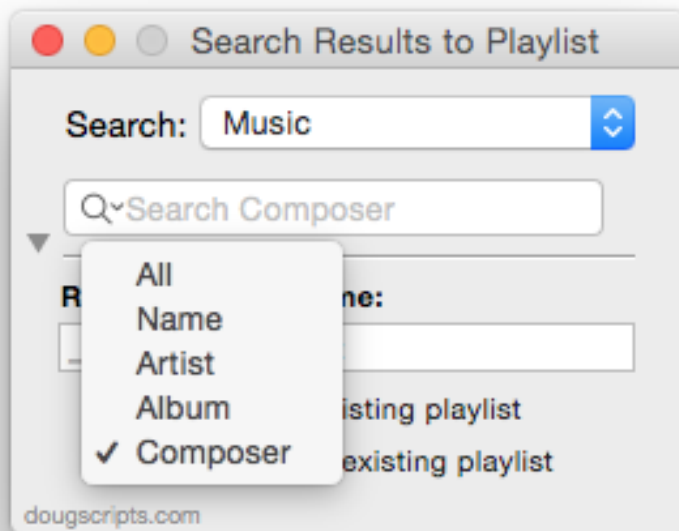


By default, the Search Results playlist name will be "_My Results Playlist", but you can change this. The option to **replace** it or **append** to it will be enabled if there is an existing playlist with the same name.

Select the library or playlist to search in from the popup:



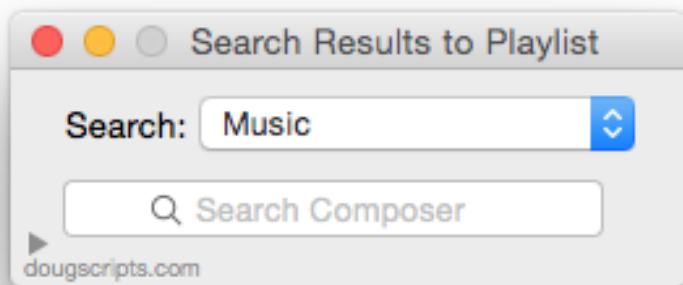
Choose the tags to search from the Search field's menu:



...enter some text to search for in the Search field and press the **Return** key.

- Each track in the results will be copied to the Search Results playlist which will automatically be created if necessary and selected in iTunes. Track copying can take a few seconds for large results.
- Will not copy the same track twice to the Search Results playlist.

- Searches are case-insensitive. There's no way around this because that's way the iTunes AppleScript **search** command works.
- Regretably, unlike iTunes' own search, TV Shows cannot be searched for **Show**. And because I am lazy, I did not change the "Artist" label in the Search field menu to "Author" when the Audiobooks library is chosen or "Director" when a video library is chosen; but Author, Director and Artist are effectively the same tag.
- The Disclosure triangle toggles the size of the window, hiding the Playlist options:



- **Quit** the script by clicking on its red close button or by pressing **Command-Q**. Settings (except for the search term) will be saved between launches.
