This script re-creates a selected playlist (excepting library playlists, Playlist Folders and "special" playlists) so that its Songs View column settings are the same as the main Music library (taking advantage of the fact that new playlists acquire the Music library playlist's visible sort columns).

Installation:

Put AppleScripts in your iTunes "Scripts" folder. This is located in your *[user name] / Library / iTunes /* folder.

*The user Library directory is hidden by default. To make it visible, hold down the Option key on your keyboard and select **Go > Library** from the Finder.*

If there is no folder named "Scripts" in the *[user name] / Library / iTunes /* folder then create one and put the script(s) in it. AppleScripts will then appear in iTunes' Script menu, and can be activated by selecting by name and clicking. Be sure to also save this Read Me document in a safe and convenient place.

How to use:

Select a playlist or Smart Playlist by clicking its name in the iTunes sidebar and then launch the script by selecting it from iTunes' Script menu.

In a moment, the selected playlist will be replicated—that is, a new playlist will be copied from the original and the original will be deleted—with the Songs View visible column options of the "Music" library.

- In iTunes 12.2 and later, the playlist will initially display using the Playlist View. For better or worse, this is iTunes' default behavior.

iCloud Music Library considerations:

- “For You” and “New” and “Apple Music Playlists” items are inaccessible.
- It is *possible* that the original playlist will be restored and the new playlist deleted due to issues with syncing. This may be an issue with iCloud Music Library on Apple's end which cannot be overcome.
