

# Convert and Export

## v4.2

For iTunes 11+/macOS 10.10+

This script converts the files of the selected tracks in iTunes using an encoder of your choice on-the-fly (restoring your Preferences-set encoder afterwards). The newly converted files are then moved to a new location of your choice, and their tracks removed from iTunes.

For macOS 10.12 and later only.

*This app is free to try for 10 days. If you like it you can purchase a code for \$2.99 which will unlock the 10 day trial restriction and enable the sub-folder options. Launch the app and click "Register..." in its File menu to make an in-app purchase through PayPal.*

## Installation:

This script is an **AppleScript applet** and can be run by double-clicking its icon in the Finder. However, it is probably best accessed from the iTunes Script menu.

Put AppleScripts in your iTunes "Scripts" folder. This is located at *[user name] / Library / iTunes / Scripts /*.

*The user Library directory is hidden by default. To make it visible, hold down the Option key on your keyboard and select **Go > Library** from the Finder.*

If the *[user name] / Library /* folder does not contain the "iTunes" or "Scripts" folders then then create them and put the script(s) in the "Scripts" folder. AppleScripts will then appear in iTunes' Script menu, and can be activated by selecting by name and clicking. Be sure to also save this Read Me document in a safe and convenient place.

## How to use:


Select some tracks in iTunes you want to convert and export to a new folder and then launch the applet. This panel will appear:



Choose an encoder to use from the popup. Your current iTunes encoder will be pre-selected. Then click the "OK" button.

**The current settings of whichever encoder you choose will be used.** Therefore, your preferred settings should be set **before** running the script by clicking the "Import Settings" button in the "General" tab of iTunes' Preferences.


Next, select a folder to which the converted files will be moved.



*(Sub-folder options are only available in the registered version.)*


- **Don't create sub-folders** - simply save the converted files to the selected folder.
- **Artist - Album sub-folder** - save each converted file to a sub-folder named using its Artist and Album tags.
- **Artist/Album sub-folders** - save each converted file in a 2-level sub-folder heirarchy named using its Artist and Album tags, respectively.

For example, here are three tracks processed using each of the three sub-folder options (*see more about the Compilations folder below\**):



- Sub-folders will be created if they do not already exist. Exported files will **replace** same-named files if they already exist.
- Converted files will be named using the **track's Name** and the extension of its file.

Click on the Save button to begin converting the selected tracks.



After a few moments, the files of the selected tracks will have been converted and the converted files moved to your chosen folder, their tracks removed from iTunes (the

original files and tracks remain where they are), and your original encoder will be restored.

- The processing can be abandoned by clicking the "Stop" button in the progress window.

## Notes:

- Only music tracks with locally accessible un-protected files can be converted. After files have been processed, messages containing information on tracks of files which were converted and/or not converted will be logged to Console.app (located in the / *Applications/Utilities/* folder). Enter "Convert and Export" in Console.app's search field and press the return key to view the messages the app has generated.

- The iTunes tri-tone "done chime" will sound after each track is converted. This cannot be inhibited.

- \*If tracks are designated as being part of a compilation and a **sub-folders** option is selected, the name "Compilations" will be used instead of the text from track's Artist tag.

If **Artist - Album sub-folder** is selected, "Compilations" is used in the sub-folder name instead of the track's Artist name.

If **Artist /Album sub-folder** is selected, the "Album" folders will be created in a "Compilations" folder instead of "Artist" folders.

In either case, if you prefer to use a different term for "Compilations", such as "Collections" or "Various Artists", you can enter the following single-line command into Terminal.app where 'NEW NAME' is your preferred text—be certain to maintain the single-quotes:

```
defaults write com.dougscripts.convertandexport  
defaultCompilationsName 'NEW NAME'
```
