Copy Tag Info Tracks to Tracks

For macOS 12+/Music v1.2+ Find more free AppleScripts and info on writing your own at dougscripts.com.

This applet will copy specific tag data from one set of selected tracks to a second set of selected tracks.

Use with caution. Both sets of selected tracks should be sorted by Play Order (or at the very least using the same sorting) so the tag info is copied in the correct order from and to the intended tracks.

Universal, for macOS 12 and later only.

Installation:

This script, "Copy Tag Info Tracks to Tracks", is an **AppleScript applet** and can be run by double-clicking its icon in the Finder. Thus, it can be installed anywhere you find it convenient to access. However, it is probably best accessed from the Script menu of the Music app, from where it can be launched by clicking its name.

To make an AppleScript available in your Music.app's Script menu, install it in the

Music "Scripts" folder. This is located at [user name] / Library / Music / Scripts / . **Music app** will look for AppleScripts in this folder.

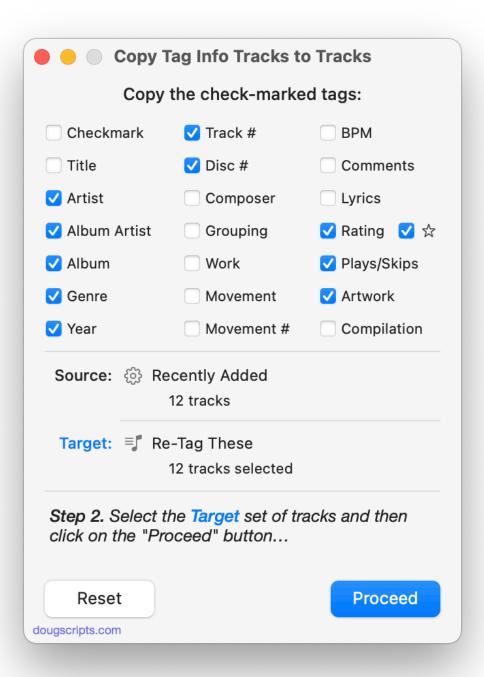
The user Library directory may be hidden by default. To make it visible, hold down the Option key on your keyboard and select **Go > Library** from the Finder.

If the [user name] / Library / folder does not contain the "Music" folder or "Scripts" folder, then create them and put the script in the "Scripts" folder. AppleScripts will then appear in the Music app's Script menu, and can be activated by selecting by name and clicking. Be sure to also save this Read Me document in a safe and convenient place.

How to use:

Launch the applet. Tracks can be selected/de-selected in the Music app while the applet is active.



Put a checkmark next to the tags you want to copy from a set of **Source** tracks to a set of **Target** tracks. (These tag selections will be remembered between uses.)

• When "Plays/Skips" is check marked, "Plays", "Last Played Date", "Skips" and "Last Skipped Date" will be copied.

 When ★ is check marked, "Favorite" and/or "Suggest Less" settings, if available, will be copied.

Select the set of **Source** tracks in the Music app and click on the **Proceed** button. The number of tracks selected and the playlist in which they are selected will be displayed.

• Once the Source tracks are accepted in this way, the **Reset** button will become visible. Clicking it will clear the current Source and Target selections.

Now, select a second—and different—set of **Target** tracks. The number of **Target** tracks must be the same as the number of **Source** tracks. When the correct **Target** tracks are selected, click on the **Proceed** button again.

In a few moments, the check marked tag data will be copied from the first set of **Source** tracks to the second set of **Target** tracks.

It is essential that the playlists containing the sets of selected tracks are sorted by Play Order. The tag data is copied in the order of the first group of selected tracks. If the tracks you intend to copy this tag data to are not sorted the same way, the tag data is likely to be copied erroneously.

- Play Order is the default (and only) sorting order for playlists in Playlist View
- A playlist in **Songs View** can be set to sort by **Play Order** by clicking the furthest-left table column header; the column with the play order numbers. It is conventional to sort in ascending order, with the arrow pointing up. When a playlist is in **Songs View** and set to sort by **Play Order**, tracks can be click-and-dragged into different order. The Play Order can be "saved" by right-clicking on the name of the playlist in the Sidebar and selecting "Copy to Play Order" from the contextual menu.

The float behavior of the window can be toggled in the script's Settings.... Press **Command-comma** to deploy the Settings sheet.
