This script will list all empty user-created playlists and can delete all or just a selection of them.

Universal, for macOS 12 and later only.

Installation:

This script, "Delete Empty Playlists", is an **AppleScript applet** and can be run by double-clicking its icon in the Finder. Thus, it can be installed anywhere you find it convenient to access. However, it is probably best accessed from the Script menu of the **Music** app, from where it can be launched by clicking its name.

To make an AppleScript available in your **Music app's** Script menu, install it in the Music "Scripts" folder. This is located at `[user name] / Library / Music / Scripts /`. **Music app** will look for AppleScripts in this folder.

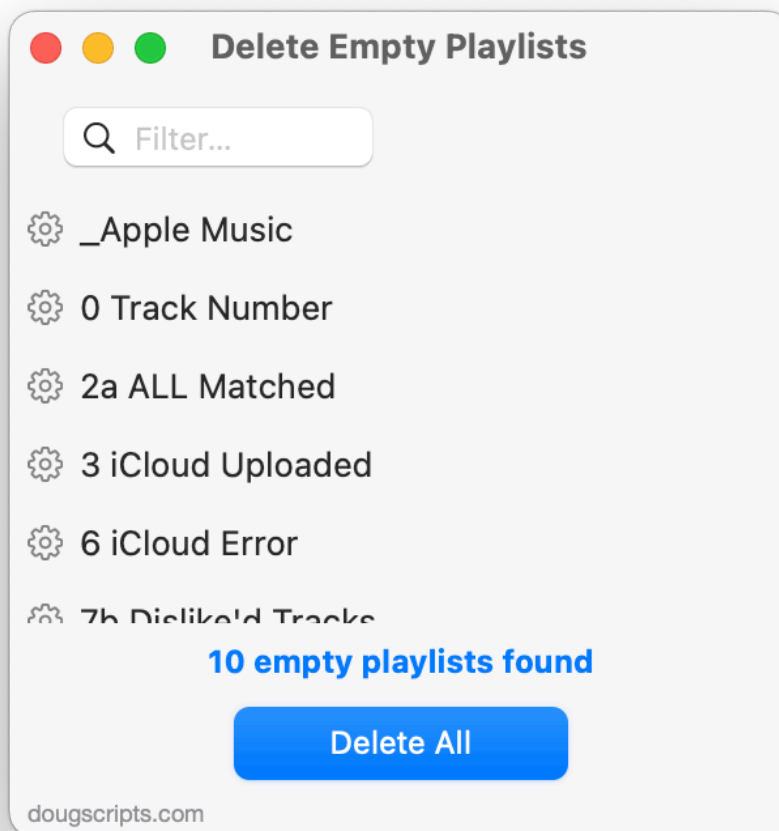
*The user Library directory may be hidden by default. To make it visible, hold down the Option key on your keyboard and select **Go > Library** from the Finder.*

If the `[user name] / Library /` folder does not contain the "Music" folder or "Scripts" folder, then create them and put the script in the "Scripts" folder. AppleScripts will then appear in the **Music** app's Script menu, and can be activated by selecting by name and clicking. Be sure to also save this Read Me document in a safe and convenient place.

How to use:

Launch the script. It will display all empty user-created playlists (Playlist Folders, Smart playlists and "plain" playlists).



- To simply delete all of the displayed playlists, click the **Delete All** button.
- When one or more playlists are **selected** in the list, the name of the button changes to **Delete Selected**. Under these circumstances, clicking the button will delete only the selected playlists.

- The **Filter** field can be used to isolate specific playlists based on the text in their names.
- **Reveal** the playlist in Music by double-clicking its name in the list.

Notes:

Perhaps obvious: The delete function cannot be un-done.

The app does not monitor Music for changes in playlists while it is running so it may be necessary to update the list manually. Use the **File > Refresh** tool (or press **Command-R**) to refresh the playlist list.

Bear in mind that it may take as long as 30 seconds for the Music app to completely update its database after *large* changes are made.
