Make Playlists By Tag

Universal, for macOS 11+/Music v1.1+ Find more free AppleScripts and info on writing your own at dougscripts.com.

This applet will create new Music track playlists based on each selected entry of a specified tag. That is, create individual playlists for each Artist, Album Artist, Album, Composer (or their "Sort" siblings), Genre, or Year.

Universal, for macOS 11 and later only.

Installation:

This script, "Make Playlists By Tag", is an **AppleScript applet/droplet** and can be run by double-clicking its icon in the Finder **or** by dragging Finder items to its icon. Thus, it can be installed anywhere you find it convenient to access. However, it is probably best accessed from the Script menu of the Music app from where it can be launched by clicking its name.

To make an AppleScript available in **the Music app's** Script menu, install it in the Music "Scripts" folder. This is located at [user name] / Library / Music / Scripts / . **Music app** will look for AppleScripts in this folder.

The user Library directory may be hidden by default. To make it visible, hold down the Option key on your keyboard and select **Go > Library** from the Finder.


If the *[user name] / Library /* folder does not contain the "Music" folder or "Scripts" folder, then create them and put the script in the "Scripts" folder. AppleScripts will then appear in the Music app's Script menu and can be activated by selecting by name and clicking.

Be sure to also save this Read Me document in a safe and convenient place.

How to use:

Launch the script.



Use the popup to select Artist, Album Artist, Artist, Composer, Genre, Year, Sort Artist, Sort Album Artist, Sort Artist, or Sort Composer. When a new tag is selected, the list will populate with each of the selected tags' entries. This indexing may take a few moments.

 If one or more playlists named with one of the selected tags already exists, a red arrow > will be displayed next to it in the list.

Use the checkboxes to choose which tag entries will be used for new playlists.

- The **Refresh** menu item in the File menu (or **Command-R** shortcut) will update the list if you have added or deleted any pertinent tracks or playlists while the applet is active. The applet does not monitor iTunes for changes.
- The Action Menu (at the bottom-left of the list) contains Checkmark All, Uncheckmark All and Toggle Text Size commands.
- Use the Filter Field to limit the list to items that only contain the text entered

Click the **Proceed** button to begin creating playlists using the check-marked entries. For each checked entry a new playlist will be created containing every track whose specified tag (eg: "Artist") is the same as the entry (eg: "Patti Smith").

It will take a few moments to create each playlist (in the interest of avoiding processing conflicts, the applet tries to allow Music time to update its database while playlists are being processed).

When processing is complete, the list will refresh.

Dismiss the app by clicking the Quit button.

Notes:

• Playlists will not be replaced. New playlists will be created *in addition to* any playlist that currently exists using the same name (the red-colored names in the list). You may want to delete the current playlist first and then **Refresh** the list.
