Track Names With Incremented Number v1.0

AppleScript for iTunes Find more free AppleScripts and info on writing your own at Doug's AppleScripts for iTunes.

This script will set the Name of the selected tracks (or every track of a selected playlist) to a user-configured string that uses tag variables for the current name [name], track number [tn], episode ID [ep], episode number [en], and position in the selection order [#]. See below for examples.

Installation:

If you installed the files from the downloaded disk image by dragging them to the "Installer", then the AppleScript and this Read Me document have already been installed in your [user name] > Library > iTunes > Scripts folder. The script will appear in iTunes' Script menu, where you can activate it by clicking on its name.

To manually install, if necessary: Put AppleScripts in your iTunes Scripts folder. This is located in *[user name]* > *Library* > *iTunes*. If there is no folder named "Scripts" there, create one and put the script(s) in it. AppleScripts will then appear in iTunes' Script menu, and can be activated by selecting by name and clicking. Be sure to also save this Read Me document in a safe and convenient place.

How to use:

Select some tracks (or a playlist; all of its tracks will be considered the track selection) and run the script.

This dialog appears:

Enter some text to appear in each Track Name of the selected tracks. Use:
 "[#]" for incremental number* "[name]" for a track's current name "[tn]" for a track's track number "[ep]" for a track's episode ID "[en]" for a track's episode number
*Be sure tracks are sorted by Play Order!
[name]
Cancel OK

Enter some text using the bracketed tags to represent the particular information from each track.

- [#] the incremented number of a track's position in the selection
- [name] the track's current Track Name
- [tn] the track's track number
- [ep] the track's episode ID
- [en] the track's episode number

(If there is no track number, episode ID, or episode number for a particular track then "0" will be used.)

For example, I want to modify my "Desperate Housewives" TV Show episodes. I could enter:

Desperate Housewives - Season 3/[en] - Episode #[ep] - [name]

Click the OK button.

A Preview of up to the first five tracks will appear (at this point track names have not been modified):

Desperate Housewives – S	eason 3/1 – Episode #301 – Listen to the Rain On the Roof
Desperate Housewives – S	eason 3/2 – Episode #302 – It Takes Two
Desperate Housewives – S	eason 3/3 - Episode #303 - A Weekend In the Country
Desperate Housewives – S	eason 3/4 – Episode #304 – Like It Was
Desperate Housewives – S	eason 3/5 - Episode #305 - Nice She Ain't

Since the process of renaming Track Names **cannot be un-done**, verify from this Preview that this is how you would like your Track Names to be rendered.

Click the "Re-do" button to return to the first dialog to re-enter text.

Click the "Proceed" button if the Preview is to your liking. In a few moments the selected tracks will be modified.

Notes:

• The **[#]** incremental number tag uses the number of the position of the track in the selection, not its position in the playlist. Thus, a selection of every other track would be numbered in succession, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5... **NOT** 1, 3, 5, 7, 9....

• I'll mention again: once you click the "Proceed" button there is no turning back and no un-doing. Make the best use of the "Preview" dialog!

• To Cancel the script from the "Preview" dialog, click the "Re-do" button to return to the first dialog and press the "Cancel" button.
