## Transfer Bookmark and Play v2.0

## AppleScript for iTunes

Transfers the bookmark point of a single selected iPod track to its corresponding iTunes track, or visa versa, with the option to play it. (That is, if you select an iPod track, the library track's bookmark is reset and can be played; if you select a library track, the iPod track's bookmark is reset and can be played.)

## How to use:

Put this script in your iTunes Scripts folder. This is located in *user name > Library > iTunes*. If there is no folder named "Scripts" there, create one and put the script in it. It will then appear in iTunes' Script menu, where you can activate it by clicking on its name.

Select a track in either iPod or iTunes and run the script. If the selected track is an iPod track, its bookmarked position will be copied to the corresponding track in iTunes. If the selected track is an iTunes track then, likewise, its bookmarked position will be copied to the corresponding iPod track. If more than one iPod is mounted, you can choose which iPod on which to search for the corresponding track.

When the script has finished, you have the option of playing the track to which the bookmark setting was transfered.
